The Lord's Supper (read in Unison)

12 noon (1200): Friends: This is the joyful feast of the people of God! God's people will come from the east and the west, and from the north and the south, and sit at the table in the Kingdom of God. This is the Lord's Table. Our Savior invites those who trust him to share the feast, which he has prepared.

According to Luke, when our risen Lord was at the table with his disciples, he took the bread, and blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Their eyes were opened and they recognized him.

Everlasting God: we thank you for commanding light out of darkness, for dividing the waters into sea and dry land, for creating the whole world and calling it good. We trust him to overcome every power to hurt or to separate us, so that, when you bring in your promised kingdom, we will celebrate victory with our savior.
